New Living Translation

As for Philip, an angel of the Lord said to him, "Go south down the desert road that runs from Jerusalem to Gaza." So he started out, and he met the treasurer of Ethiopia, a eunuch of great authority under the Kandake, the queen of Ethiopia. The eunuch had gone to Jerusalem to worship, and he was now returning. Seated in his carriage, he was reading aloud from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

The Holy Spirit said to Philip, "Go over and walk along beside the carriage."

Philip ran over and heard the man reading from the prophet Isaiah. Philip asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" The man replied, "How can I, unless someone instructs me?" And he urged Philip to come up into the carriage and sit with him.

The passage of Scripture he had been reading was this:

"He was led like a sheep to the slaughter.

And as a lamb is silent before the shearers,


he did not open his mouth.

He was humiliated and received no justice.

Who can speak of his descendants?

For his life was taken from the earth."

The eunuch asked Philip, "Tell me, was the prophet talking about himself or someone else?" So beginning with this same Scripture, Philip told him the Good News about Jesus.



As they rode along, they came to some water, and the eunuch said, "Look! There's some water! Why can't I be baptized?" He ordered the carriage to stop, and they went down into the water, and Philip baptized him.

Meanwhile, Philip found himself farther north at the town of Azotus. He preached the Good News there and in every town along the way until he came to Caesarea.




It doesn't matter what country you come from, or how long you have believed that Jesus in God's Son, you can get baptized.

Then God sent an angel to tell Philip "Go this way into the desert. God has something for you to do." Philip listened and obeyed.




He wondered why God had sent him to such a lonely place, but he knew that God's Spirit was with him. God wanted Philip to tell someone about Jesus.

"I do believe Jesus is the Son of God," the man from Ethiopia declared, so Philip baptized him in the river.




Dear Father God,







Make your own book







You will need:

2 x A4 white paper 1 A4 coloured paper (any type) empty food box 30cm thin ribbon (optional) felt pens, scissors, glue stick, ruler, pencil





1.Fold A4 paper in half lengthways & cut to make 2 skinny rectangles.



2.Fold 1 of the rectangles in half.




3. Fold the top flap in half again.



Flip the paper over & fold the top flap in half again.



Your paper should look like a W when finished.





7. Repeat steps 1-6 with your second piece of A4 white paper.



8. When finished you should have 4 W's.



9. Glue your W's together to make an accordion. Press together firmly.




10. Open food box & measure 2 rectangles 11cm x 8cm. Cut out.



11. Glue the 2 card rectangles to your coloured paper.



12. Measure 2cm all the way around your card rectangles and cut out.



13. Cut the corners off your coloured paper.



14. Glue & fold over the 15. Attach ribbon to coloured paper.



Chariot wheel omelette

Ingredients

- 3 beaten eggs
- 1 teaspoon of sunflower oil
- 1 teaspoon of butter

Equipment

- Non stick sticker
- Spatula
- A teaspoon
- Whisk / Fork





Method

- 1. Add a little salt and pepper to the beaten eggs. Heat the oil and butter in the frying pan on a medium to low heat until the butter has melted and foamed.
- 2. Pour the eggs into the frying pan and tilt the pan from one side to the other so that the eggs cover the bottom of the pan. Allow the mixture to cook for about 20 seconds and then scrape a line through the center of the omelette with the spatula.
- 3. Turn the frying pan again so that the fried egg flows into the crack in the middle. Do this several times until the mixture is all set.
- 4. You can now decorate the omelette to look like a carriage wheel with your favorite ingredients. In this picture the wheel spokes are made using a dliced red pepper and the centre is made of tomato. There are mushrooms all around the edgewhich are sprinkled with cheese.

Fill the bucket with water

A game to be played outside

You will need:

- Bucket of water
- 2 sponges
- 2 buckets or bowls the same size to squeeze the sponge into
- 2 or more players

How to play

- Place the bucket of water at one end of the garden and a bowl or bucket for each player about 10 large steps away.
- Each player runs to the water bucket and fills their sponge with water.
- He runs back to his bowl and squeezes the water from the sponge into his bowl.
- Both players get 10 turns to fetch water from the bucket.
- The winner is the player with the most water in their bowl.

If you play alone, you can have a second turn and see if you can collect more water.

At the end of the story the Ethiopian man asked to be baptised in water to show that he had changed and wanted to follow Jesus.

Pushing the car

A game to be played outside

You will need:

- A toy car for each player
- An empty plastic squeezy bottle like a shampoo bottle for each player
- Water

How to play:

- Decide where the cars will start and finish the race.
- Fill the plastic bottle with water.
- Each player places their toy car on the start line.
- After three, each player squirts the water from their bottle at the car to move it on.

The winner is the first car to cross the line to finish the race.

Racing to the Water

The Ethiopian said he wanted to be baptised without delay.

As you play this game think about how the Ethiopian acted when he heard the message from Philip.

You will need:

- About 10 lego people or plastic models of people
- Bucket of water
- Timer

How to Play:

- Place the Lego people at one end of the garden.
- Put the bucket at the other end of the garden or corridoor.
- You need to time your run (If there are two people sharing the Lego between you you'll need two buckets of water - one each.)
- Run to collect one Lego person from one end of the garden to the other to place it in the bucket.
- See how long it took you to do this? Go again and try to beat the previous time.
