



## Paul the Adventurer

In Acts chapters 13 and 14 we learn that Paul travelled all around the Mediterranean to tell people about the Good News of Jesus. See if you can mark on the map below Paul's first long sea and land voyage. Use different colours for the two halves of the journey. Anchors marked parts that were by sea.

Today, it would take just over 2 hours to travel from where Salamis was to Paphos, but there were no cars or trains when Paul made his journey. Just this part of the trip would have taken days and is over 100 miles! He also wouldn't have travelled in straight lines. Why not?
